

# **Clarinet**

As clarinet player in the Army Bands, you will perform in concert band, ceremonial band, woodwind quintet, and other small groups such as Dixieland band based on your skills and the needs of the band. Clarinet players may also be asked to perform on bass clarinet and/or E-flat clarinet if a piece of music calls for it. Clarinet players who are able to play in various styles or double on other instruments are especially valuable to our program.

# **Audition Requirements**

#### Part 1: Prepared Music

This is your time to show off your unique talents and skills. We are looking for musicians who are versatile and who have experience in many different styles of music. You should prepare at least three selections of contrasting styles to emphasize your technical, musical, and stylistic ability. These selections can be excerpts from classical solo repertoire, concert band or orchestra literature, or even jazz standards. Active Duty applicants will prepare six of the provided excerpts for their audition.

#### Part 2: Music Preparation

This portion of the audition judges how well you can quickly prepare music as if you were called to sub on a gig with short notice. The evening prior to your audition, you will be given a packet of music of various styles. You will be responsible for preparing the music by your scheduled audition time.


